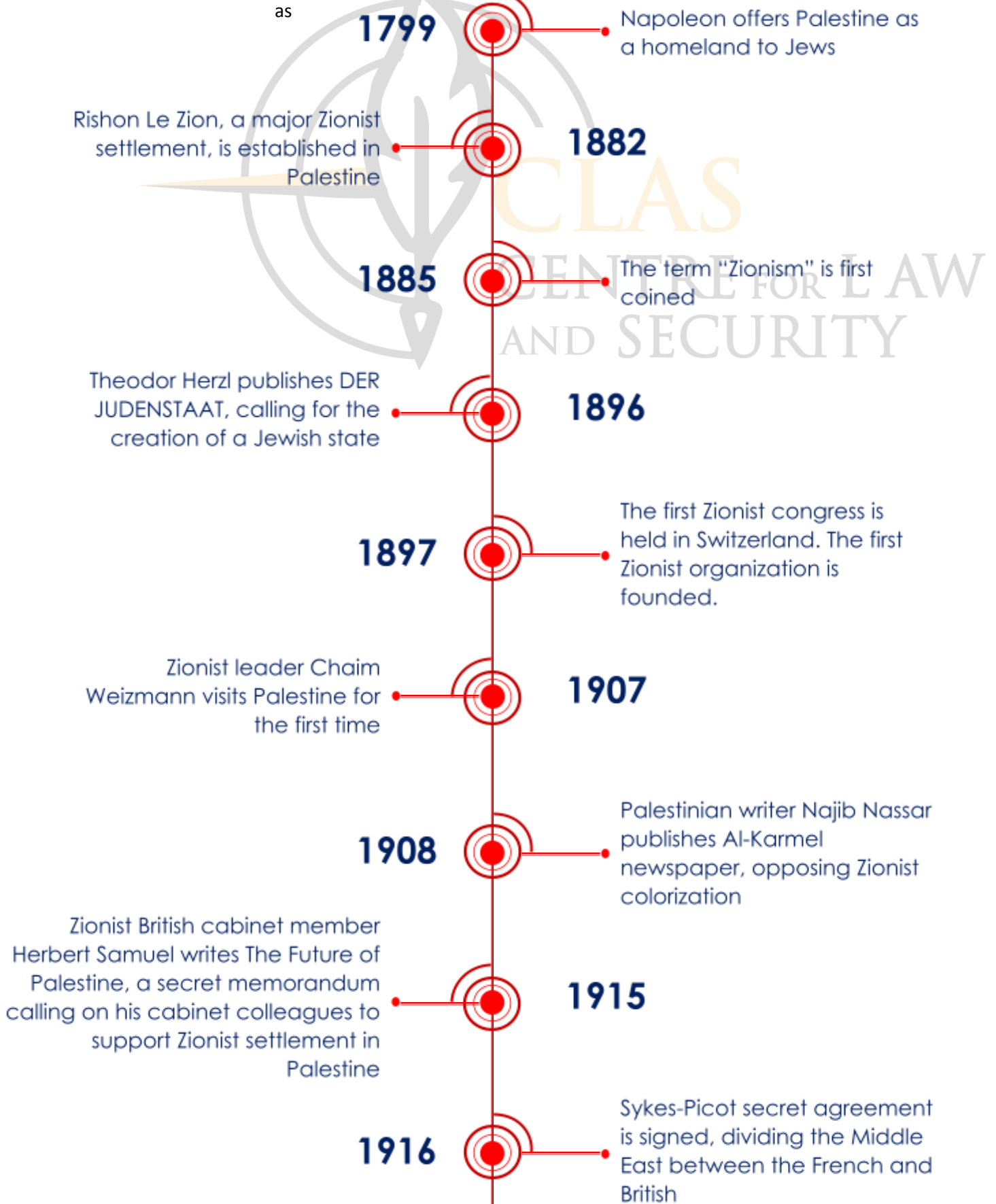
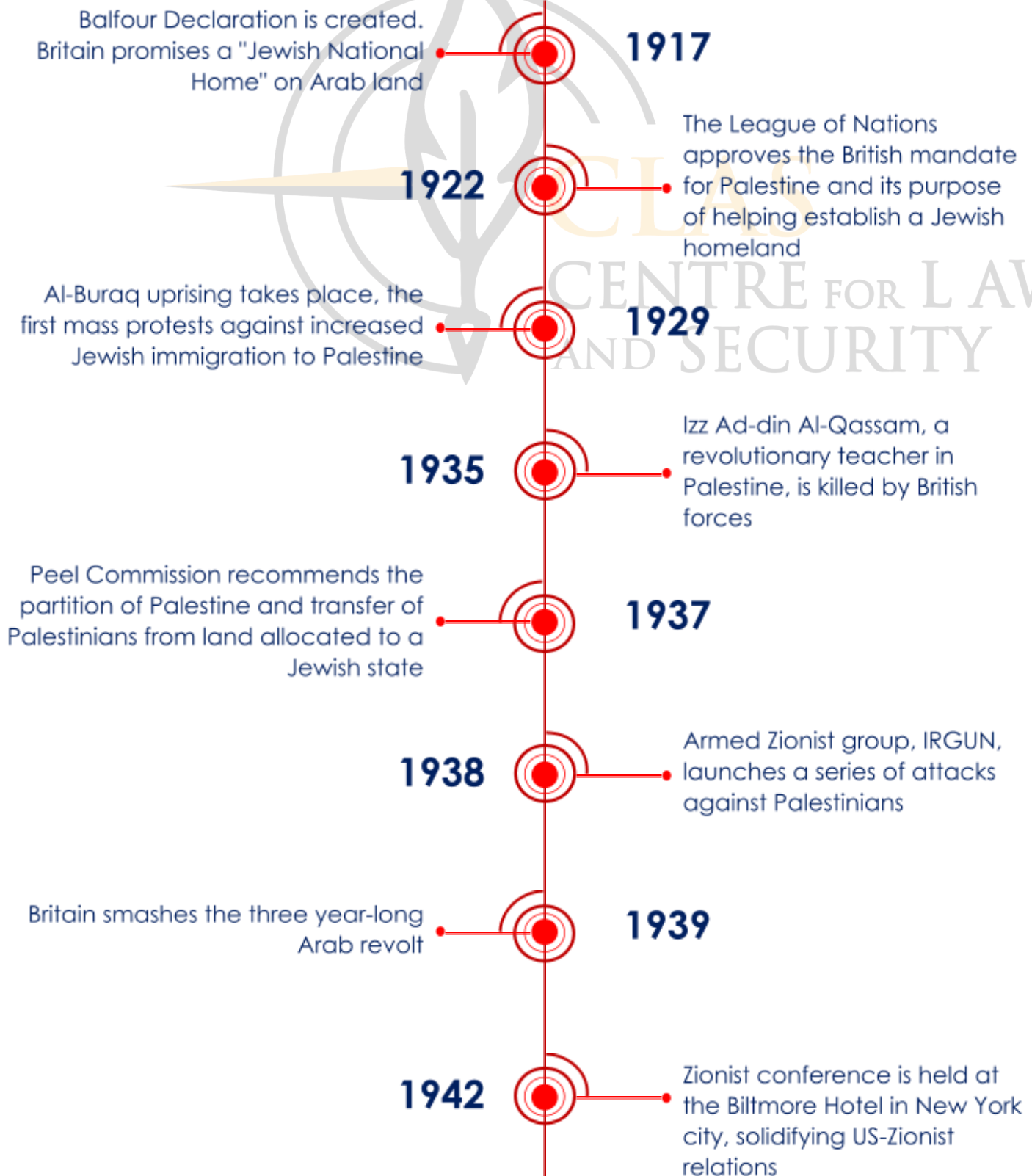

TIMELINE OF ISRAELI ATROCITIES AND GENOCIDE OF PALESTINIANS

UN adopts resolution 181, a partition plan for Palestine. Palestinians reject it.

1947

- Armed Zionist group, Haganah, bombs the Semiramis hotel in Jerusalem. More than 20 people are killed.
- Zionist forces attack the villages of Qisarya near Haifa, an early example of ethnic cleansing.
- Stern gang and Irgun forces massacre Palestinians in the village of Dayr Yassin, near Jerusalem.
- The state of Israel is created, sparking regional dispute. The US and Soviet Union recognize Israel immediately.
- Stern gang assassinates Folke Bernadotte, a Swedish diplomat and the UN-appointed mediator in Palestine.

1948

Jordan assumes administrative control of West Bank

1950

1956

Israel massacres Palestinians in the villages of Qalqilya, Kufr Qassem and Khan Younis

The Palestinian liberation organization is formed in Cairo

1964

1966

Israel massacres Palestinians in the village of As-Samu'

Israel occupies the rest of historic Palestine, including the Gaza strip and the West Bank, as well as the Syrian Golan Heights and the Egyptian Sinai

1967

1970

Israel attacks Palestinian fighters during "Black September" in Jordan

TIMELINE OF ISRAELI ATROCITIES AND GENOCIDE OF PALESTINIANS

Israel confiscates thousands of hectares of land from Palestinian citizen. Mass protests organized in response were brutally putdown; now "Land Day" is commemorated every year

1976

1982

Israel invades Lebanon

The first Intifada is launched in the occupied Palestinian territory

1987

1988

The PLO accepts UN resolutions 242 and 338, recognizing the state of Israel

The Madrid peace conference ends without a breakthrough

1991

1992

More multilateral talks take place, but the Palestinians are no closer to statehood

The PLO and Israel signs the Declaration of Principles on interim self-government arrangements (OSLO I)

1993

1995

The PLO and Israel sign an interim agreement granting the Palestinians some autonomy in certain parts of the West Bank and Gaza strip (OSLO II)

The PLO and Israel sign an agreement that requires Israeli forces to partially withdraw from Hebron

Israel reoccupies Palestinian cities in the West Bank in the wake of the second intifada

2002

2004

Yasser Arafat dies

Israel conducts its "Disengagement" from Gaza

2005

2006

War breaks out between Israel and Hezbollah in Lebanon

- Israel attacks the Gaza strip in what it calls "Operation Cast Lead"
- Peace activists on two boats drop anchor in Gaza, breaking the Israeli blockade

2008

2012

Israel attacks Gaza once more, in what it calls "Operation Pillage of Defense"

Israel launches the biggest assault on Gaza since 1967, "Operation Protective Edge"

2014

2015

Israel holds early elections for the 20TH Knesset. The Likud party, led by Benjamin Netanyahu, wins again.

- In response to rocket's fire, Israel launched four strikes against Hamas's facilities.
- Five Bedouin families had their dwellings bulldozed in the E1 Corridor of the West Bank, leaving 25 members of families in the Abu Nuwar community homeless

- US agrees military aid package worth \$38bn (£28bn) over next 10 years for Israel, largest such deal in US history. Previous pact, set to expire in 2018, saw Israel get \$3.1bn annually.
 - US President Donald Trump recognizes Jerusalem as the capital of Israel, upsetting the Arab world and some Western allies.
 - The international community does not recognize Israeli sovereignty.
 - Palestinians in the Gaza Strip conducted weekly demonstrations at the border between the Gaza strip and Israel, 183 demonstrators were killed and more than 6,000 were wounded by live ammunition
 - Fighting broke out between Hamas and the Israeli military
 - The Trump administration canceled funding for the UN Relief and Works Agency, which provides aid to Palestinian refugees, and relocated the U.S. embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem
 - The United Arab Emirates (UAE) and then Bahrain agreed to normalize relations with Israel, making them only the third and fourth countries in the region—following Egypt in 1979 and Jordan in 1994.
 - US says it no longer considers Israeli settlements on the West Bank to be illegal.

TIMELINE OF ISRAELI ATROCITIES AND GENOCIDE OF PALESTINIANS

- The United Arab Emirates became the first Gulf state to establish diplomatic relations with Israel.
- For the 13th consecutive year, the government enforced a generalized travel ban on Palestinians in the occupied Gaza Strip and sharply restricted the entry and exit of goods.
- Israeli authorities demolished 568 Palestinian homes and other structures in the West Bank, including in East Jerusalem, displacing 759 people.
- Israel limited the entry into Gaza of goods, including food and medicine, to block access to Gaza's territorial waters for Palestinian fishermen and to slash fuel imports to Gaza's power plant, further reducing the already limited supply of electricity for almost three weeks.

2020

- Zionist conference is held at the Biltmore Hotel in New York city, solidifying US-Zionist relations.
- Clashes occur throughout April in the Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood of Jerusalem where dozens of Palestinian families are threatened with eviction due to the long running
- When around 70,000 worshippers attended the final Friday prayers of Ramadan at Al-Aqsa Mosque, police officers fired stun grenades into the mosque compound, and into a field clinic.

2021

- Over 850 rockets crossed into Israeli territory after being launched from Gaza, and another 200 fell inside the Hamas-run coastal enclave.
- An Israeli airstrike hit the only COVID-19 testing lab within the Gaza Strip.
- Israel and Hamas agree to implement a ceasefire beginning on May 21st.
- Ismail Haniyeh states that Hamas will continue to fight Israel until Al-Aqsa Mosque is "liberated"
- Despite the ceasefire, violent clashes erupt at Al-Aqsa Mosque. CNN reports that journalists in the mosque had been targeted and threatened by Israeli forces.
