In recent years, social media has emerged as a powerful tool shaping politics and mobilization around the globe. Pakistan, like many other countries, has witnessed the significant impact of social media on its political landscape. From influencing public opinion to facilitating political campaigns and activism, social media platforms have become integral to the functioning of democracy in Pakistan. However, recently, social media has been facing regular disruptions while conducting political campaigns, during electoral processes and post elections times; shaping overall dynamics of politics in Pakistan.

In this regard, CLAS held a webinar to seek way forward for social media regulation in Pakistan's future political landscape.

- A Pakistan Maritime Security Agency (PMSA) sailor was martyred while two Indian Fishermen went missing after a fishing boat was caught engaged in illegal activities in Pakistani waters. According to the spokesperson of PMSA, the ship was patrolling Pakistan's Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs) when the incident took place.
- Justice Syed Hassan Rizvi highlighted the flaws in the workings of Supreme Judicial Council (SJC), particularly, in the process of fixing, listing and hearing complaints or references against the superior court judges.
- Pakistan seeking 24th Bailout, a three-year medium termed package, confirms IMF. The three-year program worth \$1.1 billion will focus on strengthening public finances, restoring energy's sector viability and returning inflation to target.
