- Pakistan has asked visiting IMF mission to do away with structural benchmark of \$7 billion Extended Fund Facility (EFF) programme under which government is bound to disconnect gas supplies to single and cogeneration captive power plants (CPPs) from January 2025.
- The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has ruled that Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf's (PTI) planned protest on Nov 24 is unlawful and directed the federal government to take all necessary measures to maintain law and order in the federal capital without disrupting public life, particularly as the Belarusian president is scheduled to arrive over the weekend with a high-profile delegation.

# The importance of Security in Pakistan-US relationship

The relation between Pakistan and the United States has been a complex mixture of cooperation and tension since Pakistan's independence in 1947. Shaped by historical events, geopolitical interests and security concerns. In recent years, the importance of security concerns has been increasing between the nations. While both countries have different priorities, security concerns remain a crucial issue that binds them.

 The death toll in gun attack on passenger vans in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Lower Kurram has risen to 42, while more than 30 people were injured.

- At least 30 people, including eight policemen, sustained injuries in clashes between police and protesters in Azad Jammu and Kashmir's southern town of Kotli, during demonstrations against a recent ordinance promulgated to "regulate public assemblies".
- The New Gwadar International Airport, developed with a \$230 million grant by China, remains largely inactive due to the failure of aviation and port authorities to market the facility internationally or engage consultants for its commercialization.
- The Lahore High Court (LHC) ordered all schools to provide transport to students, while also seeking a fitness policy for vehicles within 15 days as part of efforts to curtail smog.
- Amid concerns raised over failure of the federating units, especially Punjab, to generate the desired revenue surplus, the IMF mission sought exact timelines from provinces for their contributions to spending on the higher education and BISP programme for curtailing expenditures.


